- Obtain experience with implementation of a grant funded by the U.S.
 Department of Education

- Goals: (a) train districts in comprehensive multi-tiered school mental health; (b) train school-based mental health providers on evidence-based mental health services in schools; and (c) retain school-based mental health providers for employment to better meet student mental health needs within ESU 2
